MARKET RABBIT RULES

RECOMMENDED

BREEDING DATE: Thursday, December 19, 2018

ENTRIES DUE: Thursday, January 24, 2019, by 6:00 p.m. at the Fair Office by 4-H Leaders/ Ag Teachers ONLY.

CHECK-IN: Saturday, March 30, 2019 9:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.

JUDGING: Saturday, March 30, 2019 11:30 a.m.

ENTRY FEE: \$10.00 per pen (2 pen limit OR 1 single fryer)

EARLY RELEASE: Saturday, March 30, All non-placing pens will be released after the top 35 pens are placed in pens along with the top 5 single fryers, after you are dismissed by Rabbit Chairperson.

CHECK-OUT: Sunday, April 7, 2019, 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.

1. All entries for this division will be subject to the General Livestock Rules of the Galveston County Fair & Rodeo, Inc. except where they conflict with the requirements of this division in which case the division rules will prevail. In the event of special circumstances that may arise, or a conflict between rules, decisions of the Show Chairperson and the Livestock Superintendent will be final.
2. At the time of kindling (giving birth), each exhibitor must own the doe or does from which they pick their meat pens and that possession must be in effect at the time the market entries are due but not less than 71 days prior to the meat pen show. Both the doe and babies must be available for random checks any time from 71 days prior to the show until the date of the show. In the event that a doe with a live litter dies, the doe should be temporarily preserved (possibly freezing) and the Rabbit Chairperson immediately notified. The litter may be fostered to another doe and once the death has been verified by the chairperson, the doe may be disposed of.
3. There must be at least one (1) doe per child in order to family tag.
4. All doe's must be permanently and legibly earmarked as described in rule #6. Doe's with Major show tattoo's must also be earmarked according to rule #6.
5. The rabbit's location, tattoo, breed and variety must be filled out on the **Meat Pen Rabbit Entry Verification Form** and turned in to the fair office with the market entry by the Ag. Teacher or the 4H Club Leader. Any entry that is found to have been purchased or given to the exhibitor after the entry was kindled will be removed from the show immediately and all awards won by this entry will be forfeited.
6. All animals must be permanently and legibly earmarked in the **left ear**. The tattoo is to only contain 3 to 5 numerals 0-9 and/or letters A-Z. The tattoo is to contain no language of a profane or sexual nature. Rabbits not legibly earmarked must be disqualified from the class. Legibility of the earmark is at the discretion of the judge.
7. Rabbit entries will be limited to two (2) meat pens of three (3) fryer rabbits OR one (1) single fryer rabbit not over 70 days of age.
8. Maximum weight per fryer is five (5) pounds. The minimum weight per fryer is three (3) pounds. Each fryer will be weighed upon check-in.
9. Any rabbit found to be diseased will be removed from the show arena immediately. All other ARBA disqualifications will be removed by the judge at the time of judging. One sifted fryer rabbit will disqualify entire pen. No substitutes will be allowed.
10. A registered ARBA judge will be used. Judging will be according to ARBA Standard of Perfection with the exception of the weight of the rabbits. See rule #8.
11. All rabbits in a pen shall be the same breed and that is recognized by the ARBA as a commercial rabbit. No crossbred rabbits will be shown.
12. This is a carrying cage show. Each exhibitor will be responsible for getting their rabbits to and from the judging show table.
13. **Only the Exhibitor and one (1) parent/guardian/representative will be allowed to enter the showing after the rabbits have been weighed and have gone to the judge for sifting. If you leave the showing during check-in you will not be allowed to re-enter until check-in has closed.**
During Judging – Only the Exhibitor and one (1) parent/guardian/representative will be allowed in the showing. All others will have to sit in the bleachers outside of the showing to watch the show.
14. Exhibitors are responsible for feeding and watering their rabbits and keeping pens clean at all times. Exhibitors must bring their own feed and water containers. Failure to comply, as determined by the Rabbit Chairperson and Livestock Superintendent, will result in removal of the animal from the Fairgrounds, forfeiture of all prizes and awards, and/or further disciplinary action as deemed appropriate by the Galveston County Fair & Rodeo, Inc. Executive Committee.

15. Absolutely no boxes, feed, or equipment may be stored on floor under cages. Items found under the cages will be removed by Fair Officials.
16. The overall Grand Champion and Reserve Champion rabbits will be selected from the meat pens only.
17. Numerical placing ribbons will be given to the single fryer rabbits.
18. All rabbits will be removed from the fairgrounds after the top thirty-five (35) meat pens and the top five (5) single fryers have been placed and penned. All other rabbits must have Release Forms signed the day of the show before removing rabbits from the Fairgrounds. Comment cards may be picked up after the show at the Show Ring.
19. A Proof of Delivery Form (when applicable) and thank you card (see General Rule #44) will be required before Exhibitor's check can be released. All exhibitors must come to the Fair Office, with these items, to sign for their check.

This form is to be completed by all rabbit exhibitors and turned in to the fair office in conjunction with the market entries by the date set by GCF&R. **ONE FORM PER CHILD - For family tag: List all doe's on each child's form.**
